

#### 2022 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN REFLECTION – I HAVE CALLED YOU FRIENDS

When Chairman Pete Van Gieson called to ask if I would serve on the Stewardship Committee my thoughts were laser focused and twofold: First, I thought now there is something I have not done before. Second, I doubt if I will offer to provide a ministry moment. My lazy pronunciation and rusty speaking skills do not need to be shared with an unsuspecting congregation. I soon learned the campaign would center on "I Have Called You Friends." There is more to that scripture, but let's begin there. Since being baptized at Westminster sixty-eight years ago, I am certain my church friends must number in the thousands. My maternal grandparents were members, their children as well. My parents were married in the Sanctuary in the 1940's, my brother and I were baptized in the 1950's, Camille and I were married at the Mason City (IL) Presbyterian Church by a Westminster minister in the 1970's. In the 1980's our children were baptized in the Sanctuary by my brother, their uncle, the Rev. Dr. David Massey.

Yet, our church family is so much larger. Several years ago, Camille and I were serving home communion to a member, perhaps twenty or thirty years our senior. She mentioned that as a young wife and mother she had served numerous times in the kitchen at the church. I knew the woman's sons from high school; I asked if she knew my grandmother. Although she was much younger than my grandmother at the time, she revealed that they were good friends and enjoyed working together at church.

It matters not how many years or months or days you have felt welcomed in this church, multiple generations of church friends are brought together by the Friendship of Christ. If you would please, take a look at last week's bulletin. It was eight pages long, four directly related to the worship service, four detailing education and fellowship, events, mission, calendar, and church governance. It certainly appears to be a very engaged congregation, wouldn't you agree?
