WORSHIP AND ADULT ED PRESENTATION

Sunday, January 15, 10:00 a.m.- 12:30 p.m.

Today we welcome the Rev. Jimmie R. Hawkins as our guest preacher at the 10:00 a.m. worship service. Rev. Hawkins will present an Adult Education Forum following worship from 11:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. in Parish Hall. This will be geared toward Presbyterians as we learn more about Jimmie's role as Director of the Presbyterian Church (USA) Office of Public Witness.



REV. HAWKINS' BIO:

Rev. Hawkins is the Director of the Presbyterian Church (USA) Office of Public Witness in Washington, D.C. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Social Studies from North Carolina Central University (Durham, NC); a Master of Arts in Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (Richmond, VA); and a Master of Divinity from Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary (Atlanta, GA).

Rev. Hawkins served as Treasurer on the Church World Service global board and as a board member of the National Council of Churches. He was a board trustee with Union Presbyterian Seminary. He is a tri-chair of the Washington Interreligious Staff Community and the Heads of Washington Offices. He has chaired several interfaith/ecumenical and non-profit boards and currently serves as Director of Presbyterian Ministries at the United Nations.

His book, <u>Unbroken and Unbowed: A History of Black Protest in America</u>, published by Westminster John Knox Press, came out in February 2022. Copies of Rev. Hawkins' book will be available for those who would like to purchase one. The cost is \$30.00.
