In ancient times, the bells of church towers were silenced through the four weeks of Advent. However, during the singing of the angelic song, Gloria in Excelsis Deo, the bells rung out in peals of joy. At Westminster, our ringing of the bells of Christmas follows this old tradition.

The paraments on the pulpit, lectern, and communion table and the clergy stoles are white, the liturgical color for Christmastide. On the pulpit, the embroidered symbol is a Cross Etoile, a compound symbol combining cross forms with trefoil finials, which create a star.
