General Assembly levels, and come from WPC's Operating Fund and individual per capita giving. Westminster also provided \$1,000 to a neighboring PC(USA) church in 2020 to help sustain their operations after an accident rendered their sanctuary unusable.



Pentecost Offering

This denomination-wide special offering, collected in June, "helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children," locally and around the world. Members contributed \$395 in 2020.

Presbyterian Women hold an annual fundraiser to **National** support the **Church World Service Blankets** Worldwide program, which provides needed emergency supplies and home necessities to people worldwide in times of need, particularly moments of emergency and disaster. WPC members contributed \$1,045 in 2020.



Fair Trade

Equal Exchange coffee, tea, and chocolate are sold monthly in the West Narthex after services, supporting economically just, environmentally sound products, and small, independent producers.

WPC children support Heifer International with morning offerings. This goes toward Sunday purchasing animals with which people around the

world can gain sustainable income and independence. In 2019-20. WPC children gave \$360 to purchase 18 flocks of chicks to help

families develop food production for themselves.

Compass has continued in adapted form during the pandemic, meeting children's academic, social, and nutritional needs despite the inability to gather in person. Westminster has also provided \$5,000 in supplemental funding during the crisis.

Our Parish Hall hosts the **Contact Ministries** annual Christmas Distribution, in which over 400 area families are provided with numerous household needs, Christmas gifts, and holiday food.

Helpful Emergency Assistance for Living funds are shared by the congregation and distributed at the discretion of the pastors to individuals and **Contact**

Ministries for emergency needs. These offerings totaled \$3,972 in 2019, and the pace of giving has gone up significantly in 2020, with

\$26,487 received since the pandemic began.

IL Coalition Against Domestic Violence

Westminster funded this organization with \$2,000 in 2020 to help supply emergency basic necessities to victims of domestic violence throughout the state.

WPC was one of the founders of **Contact Ministries**, whose mission is "to daily serve the greater Springfield community by providing food, shelter, clothing,

financial assistance referrals, and life skills education and training through Christ's love & compassion," with a broad array of

services, including shelter for homeless women & children. WPC has two Board members, is providing \$9,500 in 2020, and takes part in many individual projects as described elsewhere. The PW Elizabeth Circle also typically volunteers monthly at their housing center.



Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity builds homes in communities worldwide to help people achieve sustainable, safe home ownership. Here in Springfield, the group also assists by constructing affordable wheelchair ramps. Westminster


particular food items. WPC mission grant funds also supplied \$2,500 in 2020 to help ensure a steady supply of more nutritious food offerings.

Building on relationships from a recent mission trip, WPC was made aware of widespread food deficiencies arising in Kenya from pandemic-related shutdowns and travel restrictions. WPC provided \$2,000 in assistance through the Outreach Foundation.

WPC built and maintains a micropantry at Graham Elementary School, offering food and basic supplies according to a "Take what you need: leave what you can" model. The pantry has sparked participation from the rest of

the neighborhood and has seen heavy use. Westminster members visit the pantry at least 6 times per week and keep it clean and well-stocked. The church maintains a supply of food and reimburses purchases for the pantry. From May through September 2020, the church has provided \$2,365 in funding, on top of many independent contributions from members.

Meals on Wheels

WPC takes on two weeks of deliveries each summer in service of **Meals on Wheels**, a **Senior Services of Central Illinois** program that supports independent

living by delivering food to seniors with difficulty preparing their own meals. Get involved: Sign up to help with summer deliveries.



St. John's Breadline

Springfield's St. John's Breadline provides daily, hot, nutritious meals to anyone in need, giving people the opportunity to spend their time seeking jobs and education instead of food. Westminster raised \$554 in 2019.

Faith Coalition for the Common Good

WPC is a member organization, has a staff member on the Board, has sent members to their annual week-long leadership training,

and is contributing \$3,400 in 2020.



Historic West Side Neighborhood Association

Westminster Presbyterian Church is a member of this association, which since the 1970s has been involved in city planning, advocacy, and development of the residential character of the neighborhood in which our church sits.





Steadfast Neighbor Mission

Westminster has begun a new initiative to invest in the neighborhood immediately surrounding our church building. This is an exciting and growing area of our mission and outreach. Two major projects came to fruition in 2020:

- Neighborhood Service Week Around 50 members of the Westminster family, including youth and adults, spent a week in the summer tackling home and property improvement projects on behalf of neighbors of the church, taking on numerous painting, fence-building, bricklaying, landscaping, power washing, and other assignments by request of the homeowners. Westminster funded the work as well, providing \$13,210 to cover equipment and supplies for the week.
- Matching Grants WPC also offered nearby residents the opportunity to request grants to help them pay for other needed repairs and improvements to their homes. This was a popular offering, and WPC approved 20 grants totaling \$16,557.

Funded by the Support & Endowment Fund, this area of mission is only expected to grow from here, with the Steadfast Neighbor Mission budget increasing from \$30,000 in 2020 to \$45,000 in 2021.
