FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

BUILDING A LEGACY OF FAITH - Ten years ago, this month, the Support and Endowment Committee hosted their first reception to lay the foundation for the Building a Legacy of Faith Anniversary Endowment Campaign which officially began in January 2015. Kathy and Randy Germeraad hosted the gathering of over 40 members. In the last decade Westminster's Endowment Plan has grown from \$1.9 million to \$9 million. Endowment Earnings have provided \$783,500 in capital improvements and \$836,500 in mission giving to countless ministries locally, nationally, and internationally. Additionally, loan payments have been made since 2020 to reduce our original Steadfast Neighbor Site and Landscape Plan loan from \$1.2 to \$1.05 million.

Last Founders' Sunday we celebrated the Steadfast Neighbor Habitat Build welcoming the Capler Family as our new neighbors. This year we will host a "Welcome to the Neighborhood" Party for our newest neighbors, the Velasquez Alonso Family.

Dr. Kieffer has served on COGA since June of 2020.

The 226th General Assembly begins with online committee meetings June 25 - 27. Commissioners will then travel to Salt Lake City for the plenary June 29 - July 4, 2024. This assembly's theme "Live into Hope" is based on Jane Parker Huber's hymn. Dr. Kieffer will also be attending the assembly this summer.

On Trinity Sunday, May 26, we will welcome the Rev. Ann Schwartz to our pulpit. Rev. Schwartz joined the Great Rivers Presbytery staff as our Lead Presbyter in 2023.

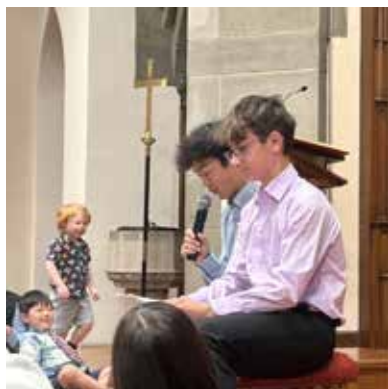
