

WESTMINSTER SUPPORT AND ENDOWMENT FUND: BUILDING A LEGACY OF FAITH

In May of 2015, on the 180th Founders' Sunday, Westminster dedicated the Building a Legacy of Faith Twenty-Year Anniversary Endowment Campaign and established the ALBERT HALE CIRCLE. During the five-year campaign the market value of Westminster's Support and Endowment Fund grew from \$1.9 to \$8.1 million. As of March 31, 2024, the market value of the Support and Endowment Fund was \$8,983,689. This does not include planned gifts.

Brief History of Westminster's Refugee Ministry

NEWLY CREATED REFUGEE SUBCOMMITTEE, co-chaired by Rachael Hickman and Jess Weitzel, made a presentation to Session in May, 2023, asking for approval to move forward with an application to Welcome Corps (a government program), and to seek ministry partners to join in hosting a refugee family of four, who will call Springfield their new home. The Betty Smith Mission Fund which focuses on international mission will provide monetary resources for this endeavor.

A presentation introducing the Refugee Ministry was made to the congregation on Sunday, June 30, 2023. In December of 2023 Archivist Sue Cull provided a brief history of Westminster's refugee outreach during our 188 years. Over 50 members were recruited to partner in this ministry and serve on the five teams: Benefits and Healthcare (led by Rachael Hickman), Education and Language (led by Lynn McMenamin and Richard Leary) Finance and Employment (led by Bob Leffler and Jesse Weitzel), Housing and Basic Necessities (led by Jeanne VanGieson) and Welcome and Local Orientation (led by Krista Steller).

In February 2024 Session approved the utilization of the 522 S. Glenwood Rental Home for housing and work began preparing the home with a Lenten Housewarming Drive to fill the home with donated furniture and household items.

Javier Velasquez and Eva Velasquez Alonso, their 10-year-old daughter Javiera (Abi) and 4-year-old son Jonathon arrived from Nicaragua by way of Costa Rica on Tuesday, March 26. Since their arrival, Javier began employment through Express Temporary Service at Bunn and has a good chance of becoming a permanent employee. Javiera (Abi) began attending Graham Elementary School and Jonathon is signed up to attend The Early Learning Center (District 186 Preschool) in the Fall. In May, WPC members and friends began providing English Language tutoring on Monday and Wednesday evenings for Eva and Javier. (ESL classes at LLCC do not have openings for them until July.) Eva worked with Pat Hymans and Jeanne VanGieson to provide recipes for today's menu.
