1908 SPRINGFIELD RACE RIOT NATIONAL MONUMENT - The U.S. Department of the Interior will hold a community meeting on Monday, June 10 from 6:00 - 7:30 pm at Union Baptist Church, 1405 E Monroe St., Springfield, IL. This is an opportunity for the Biden-Harris administration representatives, Chair of the White House Council on Environmental Quality, Brenda Mallory, and Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Fish and Wildlife and Parks, Shannon Estenoz, to discuss the commemoration of the Springfield Race Riot of 1908 and

the role it played in the nation's history, including the formation of the NAACP. The site is eligible for inclusion in the National Park System. There is also bipartisan legislation introduced in the U.S. Congress to designate the site as a national monument. All community members are invited.
