TODAY, WE WELCOME THE REV. JOHN S. KAY AS GUEST PREACHER. John served as Westminster's Associate Pastor from 1984 to 1990. During the search for a new Pastor and the construction of Parish Hall, he also served as Moderator of Session and Head of Staff. He also served pastorates at Farmingdale and Jacksonville and spent six years on the Denomination's National Staff as a Consultant for the Church Financial Campaign Service. After retirement in 2014, John and Betty moved to Wilmette, IL to be near their family. He was also gratified to serve as Interim Pastor for congregations in Decatur, La Grange and Mt. Prospect.

John received the B.A. degree from Belhaven College, the M.Div. degree from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, the D.Min. degree from McCormick Theological Seminary, and the D.H.L. degree from Illinois College, *honoris causa*. For eighteen years, John participated in Illinois College Baccalaureate Services and for fifteen years served as a Charter Trustee. In 2022, he was elected Trustee Emeritus and awarded the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

When John completed his time on our staff, Betty was ordained and installed as Elder and served as our Clerk of Session. She was a faithful member of the Westminster Choir for many years and, in 1991, the Kays joined the Choir on their tour of Scotland and England. They are delighted to be able to reconnect with the Westminster congregation today.
