## 2024 YOUTH MISSION TRIP TO NOLA – JUNE 15 - 22

On Sunday, June 23, thirteen youth and eleven adult mentors led Westminster's Sunday worship and shared their experience Rebuilding Hope in New Orleans (RHINO) at St. Charles Avenue Presbyterian Church.



This year the youth raised \$12,490 toward their mission trip including \$1,550 at the Eggstastic Breakfast, \$4,305 at the Trivia Night, and \$2,127 during the Car Wash/Bake Sale. The youth received \$1,088 from the Pentecost Offering and \$3,420 from donations. ## FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

### Live Into Hope

*"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,  
because God has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.  
God has sent me to proclaim release to the captives  
and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free,  
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Luke 4:18-19*

### GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETS IN SALT LAKE CITY

The theme of GA226, "Live into Hope," is based on the hymn by Jane Parker Huber. The hymn references Luke 4:16-20 and daily themes have been chosen based on the hymn verses.



It is an honor and privilege to represent Westminster at the 226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly as a member of COGA (Committee on the Office of the General Assembly). Peter and I arrived in Salt Lake City on June 28 and will return to Springfield July 5. This is the first time the General Assembly has gathered in person since the 223<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly met in St. Louis the summer of 2018 where Rev. Choi and I had the good fortune of meeting.

We continue to hold Christian and the Choi Family in our prayers as he begins the third month of his three-month temporary leave.

### THE REV. JIHYUN OH ELECTED AS STATED CLERK OF PC(USA)



The Rev. Jihyun Oh has been elected as Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Oh's first name is pronounced "Jee-hun." Jihyun, who was born in South Korea and raised in Kansas, is the first Korean American to serve in the PC(USA)'s highest ecclesial office, only the second woman, and the first woman of color.

Oh, who is 49, earned undergraduate degrees in Biology and German Studies from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1996 and a Master of Science in Finance from Florida International University five years later. In 2006, Columbia Theological Seminary conferred a Master of Divinity degree.

In 2007, she was ordained as a teaching elder by the Presbytery of Tropical Florida on behalf of the Presbytery of Chicago. Before being selected to lead Mid Council Ministries in the OGA in 2019, she managed the PC(USA)'s Call Process Support from 2017-19; served as interim pastor at Oglethorpe Presbyterian Church in Atlanta from 2016-17; as interim pastor and head of staff at Hamilton Mill Presbyterian Church in Hoschton, Georgia, from 2015-16; as staff chaplain and clinical pastoral education resident at Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta from 2009-10 and again from 2011-15; and as associate pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Arlington Heights, Illinois, from 2007-09. She is a trustee of the New Covenant Trust Company and has served as a member of the PC(USA) Foundation Board, as an ordination exam reader in both English and Korean, as moderator and vice-moderator of committees of the 221st and 222nd General Assemblies, and as moderator-elect and later moderator of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta.

We are grateful for Rev. Oh's leadership as we live into hope during this time and place as the PC(USA).

## FIFTH ANNUAL STEADFAST NEIGHBOR SERVICE WEEK



A few statistics on the Steadfast Neighbor Service Week:

- 131 The number of properties in our neighborhood that we reached out to for our annual Steadfast Neighbor mission work.
- 16 The number of properties we repaired. There are also twice as many Matching Grants in progress, a record amount.
- 31 The number of projects we performed on those 16 properties:  
power washed 9 houses, painted 9 projects, including fences, decks, porches, railings, windowsills, doors, and our Little Pantry, construction projects at 7 properties, including repairing decks and fences, tightening stair railing, rerouting and extending some downspout tubing, cleaning gutters, installing gutter guards, and reframing and installing a new front door, landscape projects at 5 different houses, including removing overgrowth and tree trimming, and the project of the week was installing a brand new fence to enclose the back yard of our Habitat for Humanity family, the Caplers.
- 482 The sum of the heat indexes on the five days we worked. It was HOT!
- 5 The number of delicious lunches prepared by our outstanding kitchen crew.
- 50 Perhaps, our most important statistic: The number of ministry partners who volunteered their time, efforts, and true expertise this past week to continue the success of this endeavor and to benefit our neighbors. These people worked their tails off during one of the hottest June weeks in memory.

This is truly an incredible outreach which reflects the character of Westminster, and I'm honored to be a part of it.
