THE REV. DR. JOHN S. KAY PREACHES JUNE 2

On Sunday, June 2 we are pleased to welcome Dr. Kay back to Westminster, where he served as Associate Pastor from 1984 to 1990. During the search for a new Pastor and the construction of Parish Hall, he also served as Moderator of Session and Head of Staff. John served pastorates at Farmingdale and Jacksonville and spent six years on the Denomination's National Staff as a Consultant for the Church Financial Campaign Service. After retirement in 2014, John and Betty moved to Wilmette, IL to be near their family. He also served as Interim Pastor for congregations in Decatur, La Grange, and Mt. Prospect.

THE REV. GERALD W. BOUTELLE PREACHES JUNE 9

On Sunday, June 9 we welcome Rev. Boutelle to our pulpit. Jerry joined the staff as Parish Associate in October 2013. He has served Illinois churches in South Holland, St. Ann, Peoria, Springfield, Carrollton, White Hall, and Petersburg until his retirement in 2009. Dr. Roy Wehrle Preaches June 30

On Sunday, June 30 we welcome Dr. Roy Wehrle to our pulpit. Roy is an elder in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and has served numerous roles within the Great Rivers Presbytery including leading the theological fitness interview with Dr. Kieffer paving the way for her to be called by Westminster in July of 2013. Roy received a B.A. from Washington University and a Ph.D. in Economics from Yale. He has served as Artillery Officer, US Army, Economic Counselor to the US Ambassadors in Laos & Vietnam and Deputy and Associate Director for AID in both countries; Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Vietnam, 1967/8, Senior Economist, President Kennedy's Council of Economic Advisors, Member of Rockefeller Latin America Advisory Team for President Nixon, Senior Economist, Brookings Institution, and Visiting Professor at Harvard University, CEO of HEMA, INC -- healthcare cost containment service for corporations, Author of four volume Climate Policy Study for Greenleaf, Chicago, and faculty at Sangamon State, University of Illinois, and Millikin University in Decatur. Roy retired as Emeritus Professor of Economics at UIS.

The ALBERT HALE CIRCLE is listed below and includes pledges, gifts, pre-campaign gifts and planned gifts. Reverend Hale, pastor from 1839-1866, laid the cornerstone for the legacy of faith and sure foundation we are building together in the Westminster Support and Endowment Fund.

In May of 2015, on the 180th Founders' Sunday, Westminster dedicated the Building a Legacy of Faith Twenty-Year Anniversary Endowment Campaign and established the ALBERT HALE CIRCLE. During the five-year campaign the market value of Westminster's Support and Endowment Fund grew from \$1.9 to \$8.1 million. As of March 31, 2024, the market value of the Support and Endowment Fund was \$8,983,689. This does not include planned gifts.
